While the focus of our advocacy efforts will center upon <u>IPHA's 2023 Policy Platform</u>, if there are bills that you would like IPHA to consider that you don't see on the list, please share those with the IPHA team. If you have questions on the positions or tactics we are taking on any piece of legislation, please contact <u>Lina</u>, the <u>Advocacy Committee</u>, or a member of the <u>Board of Directors</u>.

As we declare on bills, we will share talking points and background information to assist you in *your* advocacy. When urgent action is needed, you will receive an advocacy alert from us. Please make sure your IPHA member profile is updated with your preferred email address and legislative districts.

Until then, we encourage you to reach out to your legislators and share your concerns and/or encouragement with them. The <u>Find Your Legislator link</u> on the lowa Legislature page is now active with the new district information. Use it to get your legislator's contact information. If your legislators happen to be on the Health and Human Services committees (see below), we especially hope you will reach out and let them know they have a public health expert in their district!
