This week was the Legislature's second funnel deadline; policy that was not agreed to or didn't have enough support died in committee. Moving forward, committee work will be dedicated only to tax and appropriations bills.

The House held public assistance reform subcommittees on both its own version and the Senate's. Moving forward, the chamber will hold a public hearing on this bill on April 4.

The House also advanced the raw milk bill and the omnibus related to gender identity and sex education out of committee. Each of those bills is eligible now for floor debate (if raw milk passes, it will head to the Governor. The education bill will be sent back to the Senate for a concurrence after it was amended in House committee).
