Prohibits HHS in a disaster emergency related to infectious disease from requiring monitoring and identification of persons at risk of catching the disease and prohibits requiring such persons to cooperate with monitoring efforts. Includes other restrictions on ordering testing and vaccinations. Deems that children who are exempt from immunization for religious reasons are exempt from vaccination/immunization requirements during disaster emergencies.
